## SDG 1 No Poverty

This Goal calls for an end to poverty in all its manifestations by 2030. It also aims to ensure social protection for the poor and vulnerable, increase access to basic services and support people harmed by other economic, social and environmental disasters.

- Operating room equipped with all modern medical equipment and equipment.

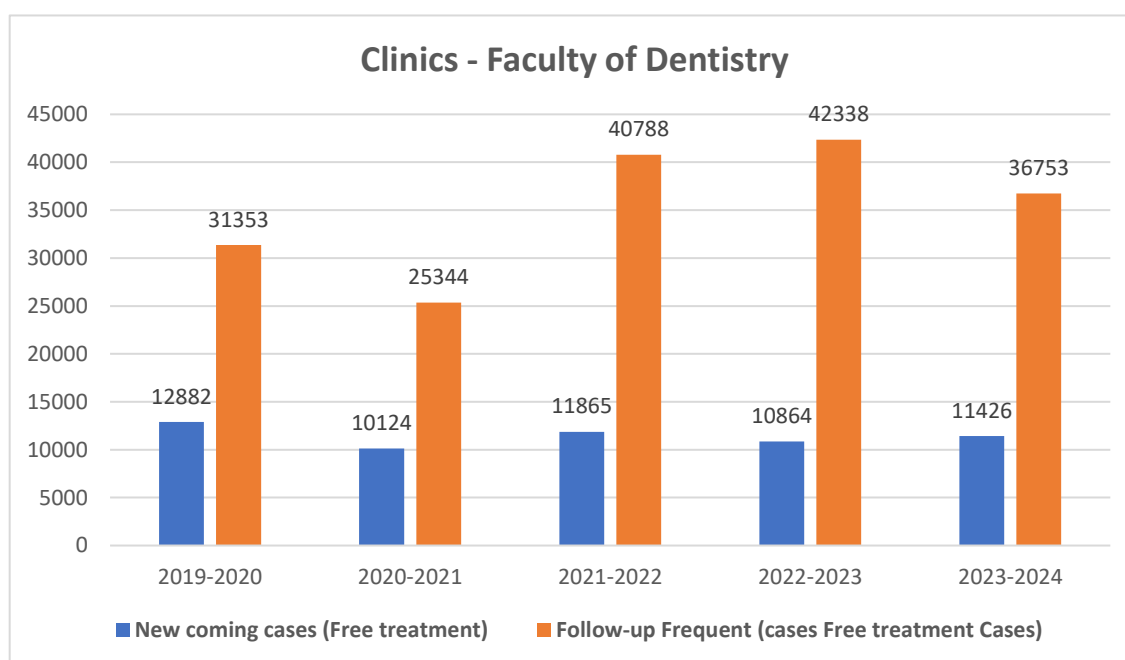
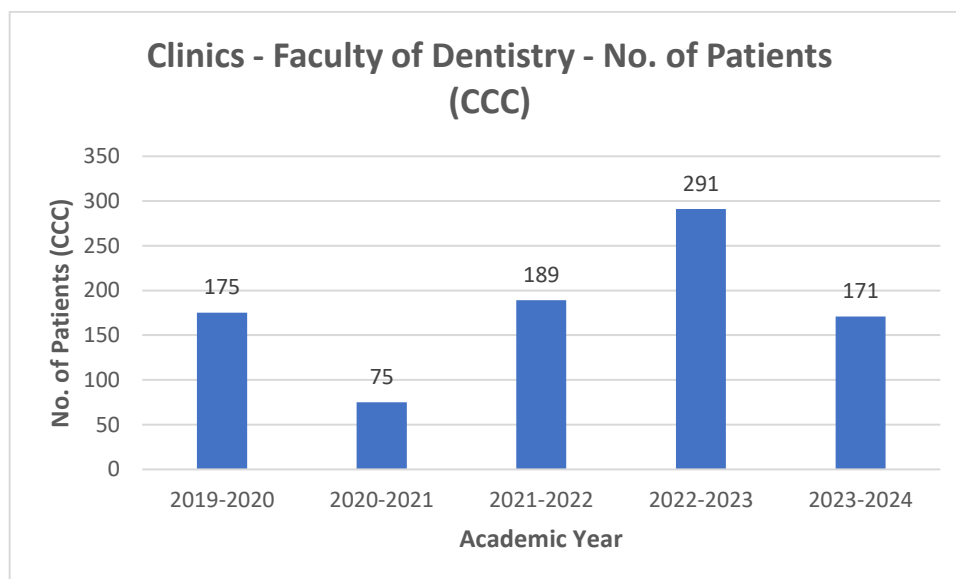
These clinics provide therapeutic service annually to more than sixty thousand patients free of charge in various branches of dentistry, these services include Conservative Treatment, Filling, Fixed, Removable Prosthesis, Scaling, Root Planning, Pediatric and Minor surgery, these services done under supervision of highly qualified dental professors, these Practical Programs Prepare the Pharos Dental Student to be strong competitors in Labor Markets.

Another special program for the final year student called CCC (Comprehensive Clinical Case) which includes Complete Oral and Dental Rehabilitation of clinical case under supervision of Dental Staff. The CCC include most or all dental branches like (surgery, Periodontology, Endodontic, Restorative, Filling, Removable, Crown and Bridge). Comprehensive case care program (CCC) is one of the programs that distinguish the Faculty of Dentistry of Pharos University as graduation projects for students because they provide a community service aimed at raising health awareness through integrated treatment and diagnostic services carried out by college students completely free for many patients (Table 1)

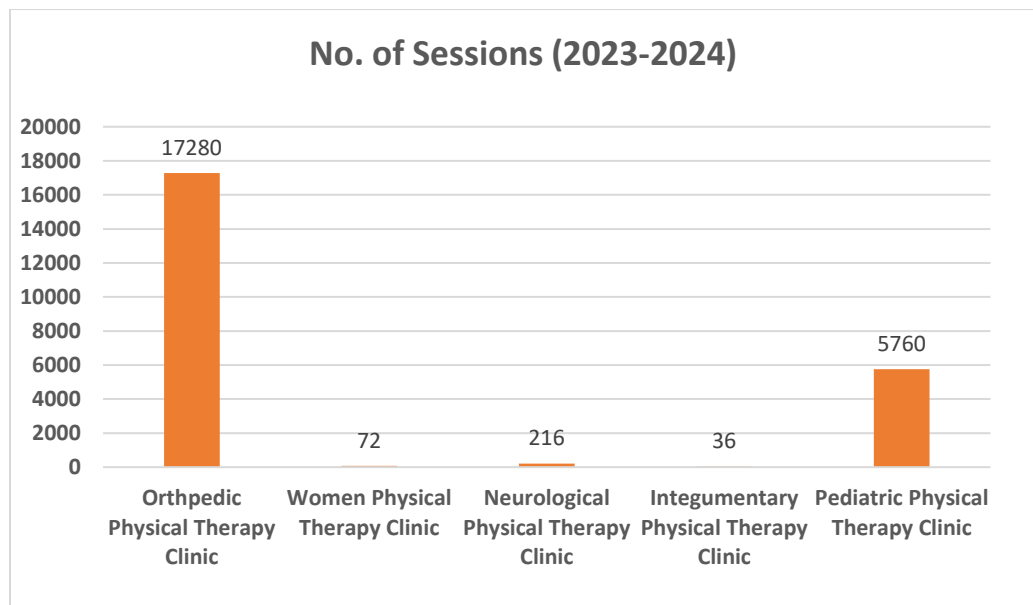
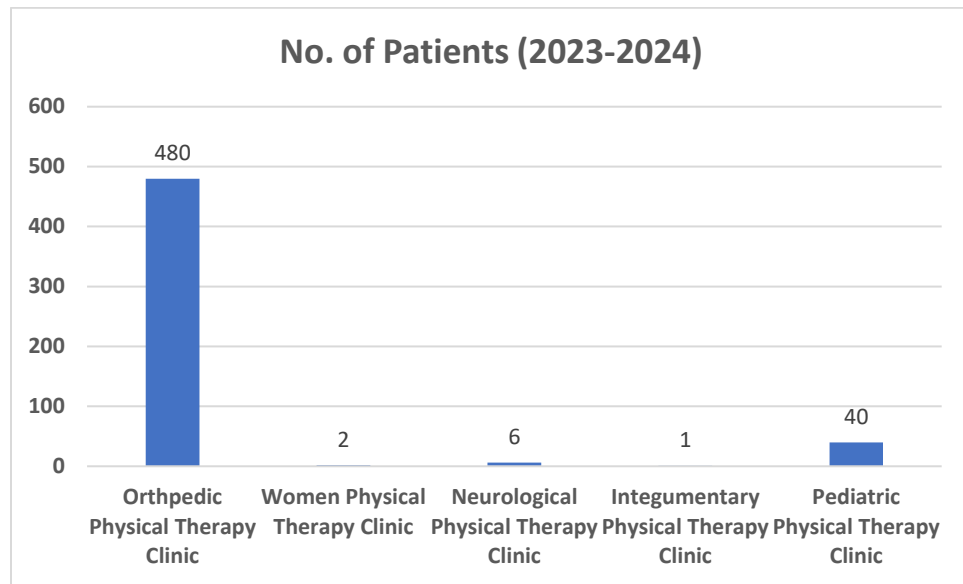

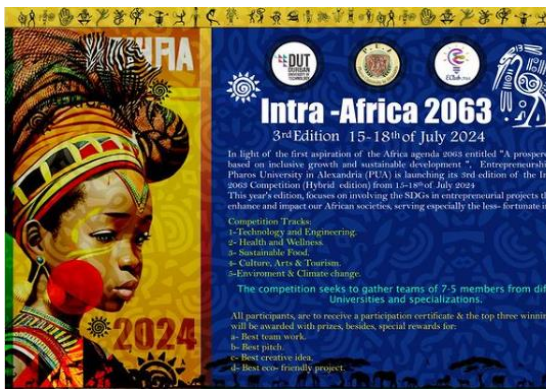
- **3rd Intra-Africa 2063 International Competition on achieving the SDGs through sustainable food systems and related themes**

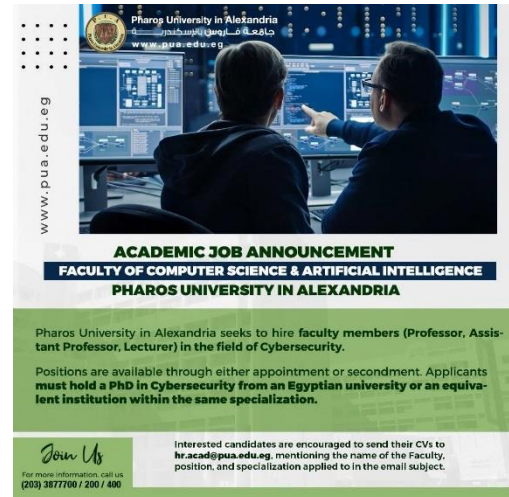

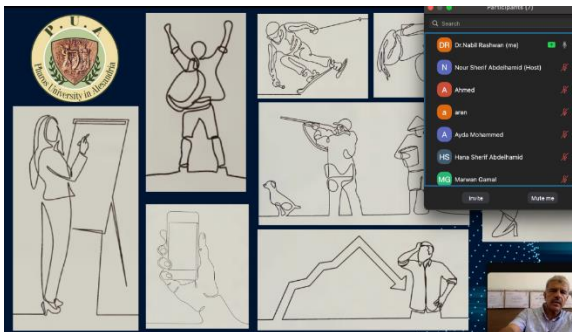


- **Startup Olympics Finals**
